

## ATTACHMENT A

- a. Participating jurisdictions designate senior staff person to facilitate intergovernmental agreement review and approval
- b. Intergovernmental agreements require project completion within two years of IGA execution
- c. Jurisdictions cannot use NR bond funds for internal staff costs relating to NR projects
- d. NROC will continue to review and recommend project proposals to the Board of Supervisors
- e. NROC will assign a higher priority to projects which have supplemental funding from other sources
- f. No participating jurisdiction will be awarded more than 50 percent of the total bond funding authorized by voters
- g. Individual projects are limited to a maximum of \$500,000 in bond funding, except for projects which include the development of a new stand-alone building (e.g., a community center), which would be limited to \$750,000.
