Re: **New Opportunity to Revive Ruby Road and Sasabe Road Funding**

With the placement of The National Guard on the border, the impact to local roads both in Pima County, as well as Santa Cruz County, will be greatly increased. We have been generally unsuccessful in trying to have the Federal government assume appropriate responsibility regarding road maintenance and/or contribution to road repairs they use. Now would be an appropriate time to revive our efforts to determine how best to secure additional federal funding to reduce and/or eliminate the adverse impact of federal agencies, including the mobilized National Guard, to our public infrastructure, specifically, public highways. It may be appropriate to coordinate our efforts with Santa Cruz County as well as Cochise County.

Please review past correspondence that has been submitted to federal agencies and our congressional delegation on this subject, as well as those responses, to determine how best to reinitiate a consultation and request with both federal agencies, as well as the congressional delegation regarding funding for public road repair impacted heavily by border security activities.
