Sales Tax Implementation Plan Ordinance and Public Hearing

Background

At the Board's May 1, 2018 meeting, the Board again discussed a draft version of the Sales Tax Implementation Ordinance, which included a draft 10 year plan for improving the condition of every paved County-maintained road, and a draft Resolution Levying a General Excise (Sales) Tax. As no changes were requested at that last meeting, the final version of the Sales Tax Implementation Plan Ordinance is now attached for your approval or disapproval on May 15, 2018. If a majority of the Board approve the ordinance, it will not become effective if or until all five members of the Board approve the Resolution Levying a General Excise (Sales) Tax. The resolution will be placed on the Board's June 19, 2018 agenda for approval or disapproval. Per state law, the Board can only consider ordinances after holding a public hearing that has been noticed at least 15 days prior. Notices were published in the Daily Territorial on April 25, 2018 and Arizona Daily Star on April 29, 2018.

Also as directed by the Board, staff have notified homeowner associations within unincorporated Pima County, chambers of commerce, individuals that submitted comments to the Sales Tax Advisory Committee and Transportation Advisory Committee, those that submitted road repair requests to the Department of Transportation, and other organizations and stakeholders. These notifications included a link to a new web page: www.pima.gov/roadrepairplan.

Recommendation

I recommend the Board approve the Sales Tax Implementation Plan Ordinance after the necessary public hearing.
