

Restoration, Landscape, and Maintenance - Volunteer Positions Descriptions

Purpose

Historic Canoa Ranch Site Restoration Volunteer

Volunteers assist NRPR staff with light restoration/construction work on the buildings inside the historic heritage areas. Projects include surface preparation prior to painting, painting interior and exterior walls on buildings, and other landscape elements. Light woodworking projects including surface preparation and general repairs prior to re-staining wooden surfaces on both interior and exterior locations. Repair and restoration of the corral areas including repair or replacing damaged materials in the fencing and gates. Other light construction, repair, or maintenance work as needed.

Landscape Restoration and Maintenance Volunteer

Volunteers work on general landscape projects inside the heritage area including clearing unwanted vegetation, pruning hedges, planting flower beds, raking court yard areas, basic weeding and general landscape beautification.

Requirements

1. Complete and submit NRPR Volunteer Application form
2. Participate in Volunteer Orientation meeting to discuss volunteer service and complete required paperwork.
3. Choose an area(s) of service and commit to approximately 8 hours per month for at least one year.
4. Complete training required for specific volunteer position.
5. Review and sign volunteer service agreement specific to the volunteer position.
6. Wear a volunteer badge, dress appropriately, and represent Pima County in a positive and professional manner.
7. Record your hours for each day worked and attendance at trainings, meetings and continuing education sessions.
8. Volunteers are encouraged to participate in continuing education sessions, trainings, volunteer meetings, and/or field trips.

Training

Historic Canoa Ranch Restoration, Landscape, and Maintenance volunteers are provided with all necessary training, tools and equipment, personal protection equipment, safety training, and on-site staff supervision.

Time Commitment and Scheduling

Historic Canoa Ranch Restoration, Landscape, and Maintenance volunteers must commit to an average of 8-hours per month during the months of October - April. All volunteers are encouraged to attend continuing education talks, classes and outings arranged by the volunteer coordinator.
