


A Shared Vision for Regional Prosperity



Public Workforce System Results

In fiscal year 2012-13

- ❖ 14,576 individuals utilized One-Stop
- ❖ 6,506 households received assistance with basic needs
- ❖ 87% of adult enrollees and 86% of dislocated workers were placed in employment.
- ❖ A total of \$4.5 million was provided in scholarships and direct training.
- ❖ 291 former high-school dropouts earned a GED through Las Artes or a high-school diploma through Pima Vocational High School.
- ❖ 1,454 youth were employed in summer jobs for a total direct impact of \$2M
- ❖ 450 businesses, non-profits, and government agencies participated
- ❖ 697 businesses hired One-Stop clients.
- ❖ 156 individuals were placed in small companies through the On-the-Job-Training (OJT) program.
- ❖ 41 individuals were placed into apprenticeships.
- ❖ Target-sector training yielded the following average wages:
 - ❖ Natural & Renewable Resources - \$18.67
 - ❖ Aerospace & Defense-\$14.69
 - ❖ Logistics-\$13.62
 - ❖ Health Science-\$12.68
 - ❖ Infrastructure-\$11.46


