On consideration, it was moved by Supervisor Carroll, seconded by Supervisor Day and unanimously carried by a 5-0 vote, to acknowledge the work of Cameron Carver.

16. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS: Painted Hills Annexation

Discussion and possible action to ask the City of Tucson to not annex the Painted Hills, 287 acres of rocky, saguaro-studded terrain west of the city between West Anklam Road and West Speedway, as the property owners have requested. Development of this land under Pima County jurisdiction already has been processed, requiring development to protect the many and significant peaks and ridges therein, to comply with Hillside Development Zone restrictions, and to comply with our Cluster Development Option after consideration of the Design Review Committee. The City of Tucson has no experience with development around peaks and ridges and no cluster option equivalent requiring public committee consideration. Discussion/direction/action. (District 5)

The following speakers addressed the Board:

1. Bruce Gungle, Planning and Zoning Commission Member
2. Ed Verburg, President, Tucson Mountain Association
3. Roger Carpenter, Gates Pass Area Neighborhood Association

They provided the following comments:

- A. Painted Hills remained one of the largest tracks of virgin Sonoran Desert in close proximity to the City and was habitat for three or more priority vulnerable species found in the Sonoran Desert Conservation Plan.
- B. There was no guarantee the City would honor the County's Hillside Development Overlay Zone.
- C. Anklam Road and Speedway Boulevard were designated Scenic Routes and a view shed for the whole community.
- D. They reported that the City of Tucson also had two other areas adjacent to the Painted Hills property which contained important wildlife corridors, mature Saguaros, washes and near the peaks and ridges under consideration for annexation.
- E. It was estimated that there were 10,000 Saguaros on the property. 4,000 of these would be impacted, 1,200 would be transplanted and 800 would be removed and mitigated.
- F. The City of Tucson's Interim Water Policy, which proposed they would not supply water to new areas outside the City limits, would be meaningless if they continually annexed new areas.

Chairman Valadez read the names of the following people in the audience who did not wish to speak but supported this action:

1. Olivia Cajero Bedford, Arizona House of Representatives
2. Robert Bruce Borden
3. Peter Chesson

Supervisor Elías stated Painted Hills had many cultural resources important to the history of our region and, if the property remained a part of unincorporated Pima County, it would be protected by Pima County Code provisions. He said City Code had no equivalent provisions and their Cluster Development Option was strictly administrative and did not provide for a public process. Although the voters had elected twice to have this land purchased as open space, the County had been unable to do so for various reasons, but, if the opportunity arose again, he felt the County would be interested in purchasing the property. He thought the City/County Water and Wastewater Study, which was passed unanimously by the Mayor and Council and the Board of Supervisors, should be taken into consideration especially in regards to different jurisdictions working together.

On consideration, it was moved by Supervisor Elías, seconded by Supervisor Bronson and carried by a 4-0 vote, Supervisor Carroll was not present for the vote,

to direct the County Administrator to draft a letter to the City of Tucson Mayor and Council stating the County's objection to this annexation and include the public testimony provided this date with the notation that Painted Hills was of significant importance to the entire region.
